SUBJECT: Minutes for Seoul Computer Club Apr 10, 2004

The Seoul Computer Club met at the USO at Camp Kim, Saturday Apr 10, 2004. The monthly topic was Digital Forensics. The speaker was BJ Gleason, Club President.

Host, Heidi Haugen, Treasurer, opened the meeting with the introduction of new attendees while attendees enjoyed pizza and sodas. There were 5 new attendees. 33 people attended the meeting.

The meeting started off with the Computer News by President Gleason. The news included: the vulnerability of Cisco routers, DOD is to release their new policy on WIFI transmissions and cell phone use, Buffalo Spammer is to be sentenced May 7th, Canada legalized file sharing, Google is now offering a new email service called G-Mail with 1 GB of storage, Australia is having a big physical security problem with hundreds of computers disappearing from government and corporate offices, Korea wants to cut Spam in half by end of 2004, last election optical scanning vote counting machines missed 6,000 votes, tighter controls are required for security camera tapes after a recorded suicide was digitized and posted on the Internet, and the originator of the Nigerian Email Scam has been sentenced to prison.

The Beginner's Corner was presented by Steve Janss, journalist for Network World, on Telework Tools that Work. Mr. Janss presented Netilla, GoToMyPC, and PBXGateway and others as excellent tools for remote computer work. These tools are scalable and affordable ways for remote and mobile workers to tie into their work computers. They provide an alternative to setting up a Virtual Private Network. Other viable tools are AgilQuest, MangoSoft, the BlackBerry 5810, and WebEx.

The main topic was presented by club president, BJ Gleason. His topic was Digital Forensics. We solve crimes by checking for data on suspect's computers. It's done by collecting, preserving, analyzing,

and reconstructing data on storage media. The main tool for this is called WinHex from X-ways Software. This application is an advanced tool that can read all kinds of disks and drives even if they have been formatted or the data files have been deleted. Only trained investigators should perform the forensics to avoid corrupting the evidence. See the presentation by clicking on the link on the Past Meetings tab.

Under new business the attendees voted to keep the meeting start time at 2 PM. The treasure reported \$2289.18 in the club treasury. The date for the Annual Golf Tournament is 16 June. Club members can participate for free.
