Host Tommy Kramer opened the meeting with an invitation to enjoy the sandwiches, BBQ chicken and soft drinks provided by the club. He welcomed the new comers to the meeting and asked each to introduce themselves.

Tommy Introduced the newly formed Seoul American High School Computer Club and its members. The leaders of the club Garry Beckham and Kurt Camerud have started The High School Computer Club. They created it to further the educational opportunities of students interested to computers and technology. SeoulCC donated a server that we were not using to the club for the students to use in testing and learning about operating systems and applications.

The main presentation was given by Willis Kim. His presentation covered Wireless home networking, he discussed terms used and their meanings. Willis then demonstrated a typical home networking configuration. Using both HyperWRT v1.4 and Sveasoft Satori v4.0 he then demonstrated how to increase the output power of the Linksys Wireless Cable Router by changing the firmware and tweaking settings. He finished with a discussion about antennas and how they work.

Beginners corner was given by David Margolis. He presented a brief demonstration on how to troubleshoot wireless networking problems in he Windows XP with service pack 2. He showed us how to reactivate the automatic wireless networking configuration services. Many third party network managers turn off the service, causing problems when moving from one network to another.

We introduced a new section to our club meetings, Gadgets Galore. John Milburn showed his new all-in-one phone. Phone, camera, video recorder, pda, mp3 player and portable USB hard drive all-in-one device. A data encryption key was also shown. The key is required in the computer USB
